Headings

These are H tags (H for headings)

There are 6 levels of headings. H1, H2, H3, ...

H1 is the largest heading (supposed to be, depending on how the fonts are set up) and H6 is the smallest heading.

H tags are already set up for font, size, color, bold, line spacing.

We use H1 for the titles of stories and titles of other pages.

We use H2 for the headings on the home page - these are a little smaller than the H1 size.

We use H3 for sub-headings within the stories, and sub-headings on other program and non-story pages (programs, garden calendar)

On story pages, H3 is automatically black (actually dark gray). On the other pages, it is rust brown - that color is set by manually overriding the black in the coding for the story text.

Ray's Rule:

Titles of stories are no more than one line. If the author makes them too long to take up two lines, shorten them to fit on one line.

References and Resources

References are items that were used to write the story, Resources are places to go for more information possibly not in the story. These titles are placed in the tags to make them bold.

They are placed in a separate container as an unordered list. You can copy the container or clone the page from the list of pages it is titled to be first in the list of pages.
